

Revelation Changes Everything

God wants His children to walk in His blessings. However, many do not experience God's provision because they believe what their five senses tell them instead of what the Word of God tells them. F.F. Bosworth said, "We should realize that the five senses belong to the natural man and that they were given to us to be used for the things of this world. But the things of God cannot be discerned, appropriated, and known by the natural senses."

Paul understood this concept also. He said in 2 Cor. 4:18, "...while we look not at the things which are seen; for the things which are seen are temporal; but the things which are not seen are eternal." This theme is continued in Hebrews 11:27 which elaborates on the life of Moses. It says, "By faith, he forsook Egypt, not fearing the wrath of the king: for he endured, *as seeing him* who is invisible." Both Paul and Moses were walking by a better kind of *sight*. They were *seeing* with the eye of faith based on what the Lord had spoken to them.

As long as we focus on what our senses are telling us, we will never believe the Word of God or walk by faith, and our circumstances will rule us instead of us ruling our circumstances. E.W. Kenyon said, "God hates to see His creation walking around in sense knowledge." God wants to lead us into a new kind of knowledge – revelation knowledge. This kind of knowledge comes about as we embrace the Word and the Holy Spirit makes that Word a reality in our lives. And that reality is greater than any situation or circumstance that we encounter.

Revelation knowledge is powerful because it *sees* God. It *sees* Calvary. It *sees* the promises of God and His faithfulness. We should constantly be looking for far better things than can be seen with the natural eye. Kenneth E. Hagin said, "One word from God will change your life forever." In other words, *revelation* changes everything.
